

#### HONORARY LIFE FELLOW SELECTION

The Farm Foundation Round Table strives to maintain a body that reflects the full range and diversity of U.S. agriculture and the food system. Honorary Life Fellow (HLF) status is conferred on Round Table Fellows to recognize their service to the Round Table and their commitment to the mission of Farm Foundation.

Round Table Fellows are eligible for Honorary Life status if:

- They have been an active Round Table Fellow for 10 or more years,
- They have a history of regular contributions to Farm Foundation, and
- They have demonstrated a commitment to the Farm Foundation mission.
- All former U.S. Secretaries of Agriculture are also eligible for HLF status and will be nominated by the Farm Foundation Board or executive leadership.



#### **EXPANDED MEMBERSHIP STATUS OPTIONS:**

#### **Temporary Inactive Round Table Fellow:**

- Round Table Fellows who, for personal or professional reasons, need to "take a break" from membership for no more than two years can request that the Round Table Advisory Council confer upon them Temporary Inactive Status.
- During this period Fellows would not need to meet the annual participation requirements but would still receive Round Table communications.
- After the inactive period ends the Fellow must notify the Round Table Advisory Council of their intention to either return to active status or resign from the Round Table at the end of the two-year period.
- Round Table Fellows who are currently working in the Federal government will be named Temporary Inactive Fellows for the length of their service.



#### **EXPANDED MEMBERSHIP STATUS OPTIONS:**

#### **Emeritus Round Table Fellow:**

- This new status level can be conferred upon Fellows who are retiring from their career but wish to remain
  active in Round Table may choose to move to permanent Emeritus status.
- These fellows must be in good standing with all Round Table requirements and will be welcome, but not required, to participate in Round Table programs.
- They will also not be required to give but may be asked for continued support of Farm Foundation.
- Emeritus Round Table Fellows still receive Round Table communications.
- This status will be recommended and conferred by the Round Table Advisory Council.

FY25 Budget reflects lower fees along with reduced costs given the locations of the meetings. (FY24 Hawaii and Denver)

Significant reduction in total registration fees also due to the Ag Scholars program. Scholars are charged guest fees to attend. Our renewed agreement with USDA reduces the number of scholars from 20 to 5 per year starting in 2025.

- The budget reflects two Round Table events with full registration fees of \$1,195 and \$995 respectively for the January and July meetings. (FY24 actual fees-Jan \$1,425 and June \$1,100). Lower than for past few years meetings.
- Event costs are up to twice what they were pre-pandemic driven by hotel, food and AV cost increases and always seeking new locations for meetings.
