Trends to Watch

- U.S. ag productivity: increasing 2% per year; U.S. demand only .8% per year
- 95% of consumers outside US borders
- In 20 years world will gain another 1.4 billion people – a 22% increase

Final Thoughts

• Overall exports account for 28% of total ag sales

- 72% of U.S. cotton is exported
- 65% of U.S. almonds are exported
- 49% of U.S. wheat is exported
- 47% of U.S. rice is exported
- 43% of U.S. walnuts are exported
- 37% of U.S. soybeans are exported
- 17% of U.S. corn is exported
- 5% of U.S. grain/oilseed production in the form of livestock products is exported
